








Two Emotional Thermometers
 Here are two emotional thermometers which you may like to copy and laminate. They may be useful on you child's desk, workstation or on the communication device/display.

Don't forget the numbers can also be used to give a rating to things.
 i.e. 'What did you think about that - on a scale of 0 - 5?'
